Gentlemen:

I herewith submit my twenty-fifth Annual Report of the Activities of the Fire Department.

The Department responded to 1523 calls. This is 418 less than received the previous year.

## Island Fire Protection

As a result of a request for increased fire and police protection, on Peak's Island, the two departments were combined.

A department of Public Safety was set up under the fire department, with two men on duty. A Radio equipped Panel truck was provided for patrol work.

Since the Establishment of this service, during the latter part of April, until the end of the year, the following work was accomplished by the Patrol.

The people on Long Island asked that a Volunteer Company be organized to take over the fire protection on the Island. They felt that such an arrangement would be more satisfactory than the practice which had been followed for years, having one man in charge of the apparatus.

Accordingly a company was established and they have taken over responsibility for the equipment. They are paid \$500.00 per year, for their services.

A 2 1/2 H.P. Siren was installed on the Island, to serve as a Fire Alarm system.

## FIRE PREVENTION ACTIVITIES

Effective fire prevention work, plus the very satisfactory Clean-Up Week and Fire Prevention Week Campaigns, to-gether with the splendid cooperation of the people of Portland, resulted in the low fire loss for last year.

## Apparatus

No new major pieces of apparatus were purchased in 1948.

An International truck with a closed body was bought to replace a small one in the Rescue Company. This was fitted out at the Fire department shop. It is equipped with an acetylene cutting outfit, resuscitator, masks of all kinds, asbestos suits, a complete emergency lighting outfit, all types of jacks, first aid kit, stretchers, and other minor equipment, including 12 salvage covers.

A Jeep Panel Truck was purchased and assigned to the Peak's Island Patrol. This carries a small amount of minor fire fighting equipment, a stretcher, and has a two-way Radio.

All of the Apparatus is in good condition, but consideration should be given to replacing the older units.

The Tractor on ladder #5 was purchased in 1922, and the rear end in 1928, This is a 75 foot wooden aerial.

Engine #9, a 750 gallon pumper was put in service in November, 1924.

Engine #8, a 1,000 gallon unit was bought in July, 1926.

## Houses

The location of the Fire Boat was changed from Portland Pier to the State Pier, where quarters are leased from the Pier Authorities. The new quarters are far more suitable and provide more comfort and conveniences for the men.

All of the stations are maintained on the inside by the men assigned to them.

However, the wood trim on the outside of the brick stations and the two stations built of wood should be painted. They have received no attention for 15 years.

The older stations should be provided with concrete apparatus floors, and better toilet facilities.

## Hose

During the year. 1850 feet of 2 1/2 inch hose and 100 feet of 3 inch hose was condemned and taken out of service.

Replacements should be purchased this year.

## Recommendations

In order to maintain a suitable supply of hose at least 2,000 feet of 2-1/2 inch should be purchased the coming year.

In view of the fact that apparently building costs will not decline for some time, I recommend that the 'Rosemont' fire station be constructed with the money now available.

Gentlemen:

I herewith submit the Annual Report of the Electrical Department for the year 1948.

Overhead Construction

Installed new line on Cabot St., (Sagamore Village) for fire alarm box circuit.

Changed wires and cross-arms from old poles to new poles on following streets: Ray, Leland, Auburn, Capisic, Veranda, St. John, Washington Ave., Stevens Ave., Brighton Ave., and Lexington Ave.

Removed messenger wire and cable on Portland Pier from Commercial St., to the old fire-boat quarters.

Renew messenger wire on Stevens Ave., at Arbor St.

Relocated pipe and fuse box on pole at Brighton and Stevens Aves., on account of traffic light installation.

Inspected all overhead construction Spring and Fall, making minor repairs and trimming trees where necessary.

Underground Construction

Removed 10 conductor cable on Commercial St., from Silva St., to Portland Pier.

Installed new 10 conductor cable on Commercial St., from Franklin St., to the new fire-boat quarters, State Pier.

Renewed cable legs, and inspected and repaired cables in man holes where necessary.

Fire Alarm Boxes

Installed new boxes as follows: #254 at Sagamore Village; #3391 Lincoln Jr. High School.

Changed the location of box #136 on Allen Ave., moving it to the corner of Pennell Ave.

Reset the following boxes: #131, #324, #425, #834, #135, and #145. Box 145 was reset three times, all caused by automobiles knocking it down.

The following boxes were completely serviced, cleaned, oiled and retimed: 131,135,138,139,141,145,152,159,27,324,43,45,425,441,51,52,515,77,753,812,814,821,834,928,929,941,944,955,961,3355.

All boxes were tested every month, and minor repairs made where necessary.

#### Maintenance

Removed the air horn from the Butler School, and installed it at Station 78, Arbor St. This is part of the outside signal system operating on the secondary circuits.

Wired the new fire-boat quarters on the State Pier, providing station lights, night lights, and fire alarm system, including the necessary shore connections for the boat.

Installed new light fixtures in the apparatus room at Station #4.

Made minor wiring and fixture changes at various stations where necessary.

On the police blue light system, replaced 5 globes and 6 lamps.

Replaced 9 red globes at fire alarm signal stations.

Made 81 minor repairs to Police Boxes.

Put up and took down ward room lights 4 times.

Made repairs and adjustments to the fire alarm equipment in the various fire stations as required.

Repaired and closed 11 open circuits as follows: Box circuits 9, Primary circuit 1, Tapper circuit 1.

## SERVICE ON TRAFFIC METERS

The practice of stealing traffic meters has practically stopped since one man was employed for the purpose of maintaining them.

The week before he went to work, 12 meters were taken, but none have been lost since.

Other items have been: 113 meter clocks changed for repairs; 283 clocks have been repaired on the street; 345 counters repaired; 183 clocks cleaned and repaired in the shop; and 327 other cases of minor repairs.

NEW ENGLAND TELEPHONE & TELEGRAPH COMPANY

The following is a report of major improvements in the plant of the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company in the City of Portland which were made during the year 1948.

The replacement of various deteriorated poles jointly occasioned with the Central Maine Power Company has been made on Howard, Turner, Capricio, Motley, Bradley, Congress, Riverside, Fenway, Dorset, Devon, Berkeley, and Brancroft Streets, also Deering Oaks (rear of Forest Ave.), and Rowe, Brighton, Warren, and Stevens Avenues.

Old and obsolete systems have been replaced with new conduit and interior cables and terminals in Trelawney Bldg., Cummings Bros., Lancaster Furniture Co., Canal Bank, and Plover Hotel, including service for a new Radio Station. Also new interior cables and switchboard for Portland City Hall.

A new 900 pair underground cable was placed for the purpose of providing additional facilities between the Telephone Building, 45 Forest Avenue, and York Street.

Deteriorated poles and covered wire on St. John St., was replaced with new poles, aerial cable, and distribution wire in connection with the new housing development.

## RECOMMENDATIONS:

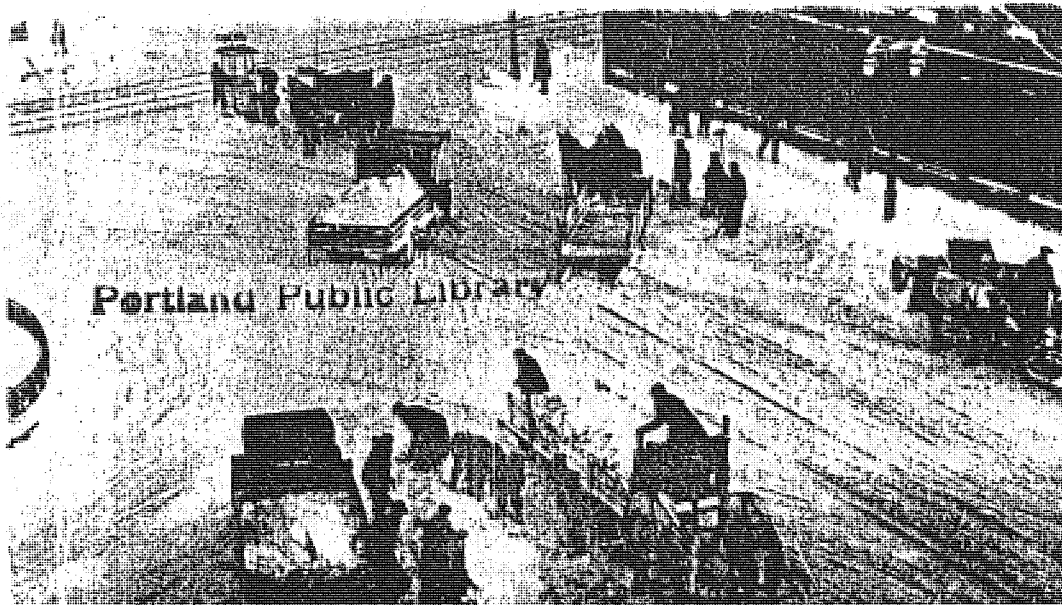
I recommend the purchase of at least two radio sets each year for installation on the major pieces of fire apparatus. Radio has proved of great value in maintaining contact with fire equipment while out of quarters. Full advantage should be taken of the investment we now have.

It would be advisable to add two more fire alarm operators. According to the pension plan recently adopted, two of the operators now on duty will be compelled to retire at the end of two years. It takes that length of time to "break-in" an operator.

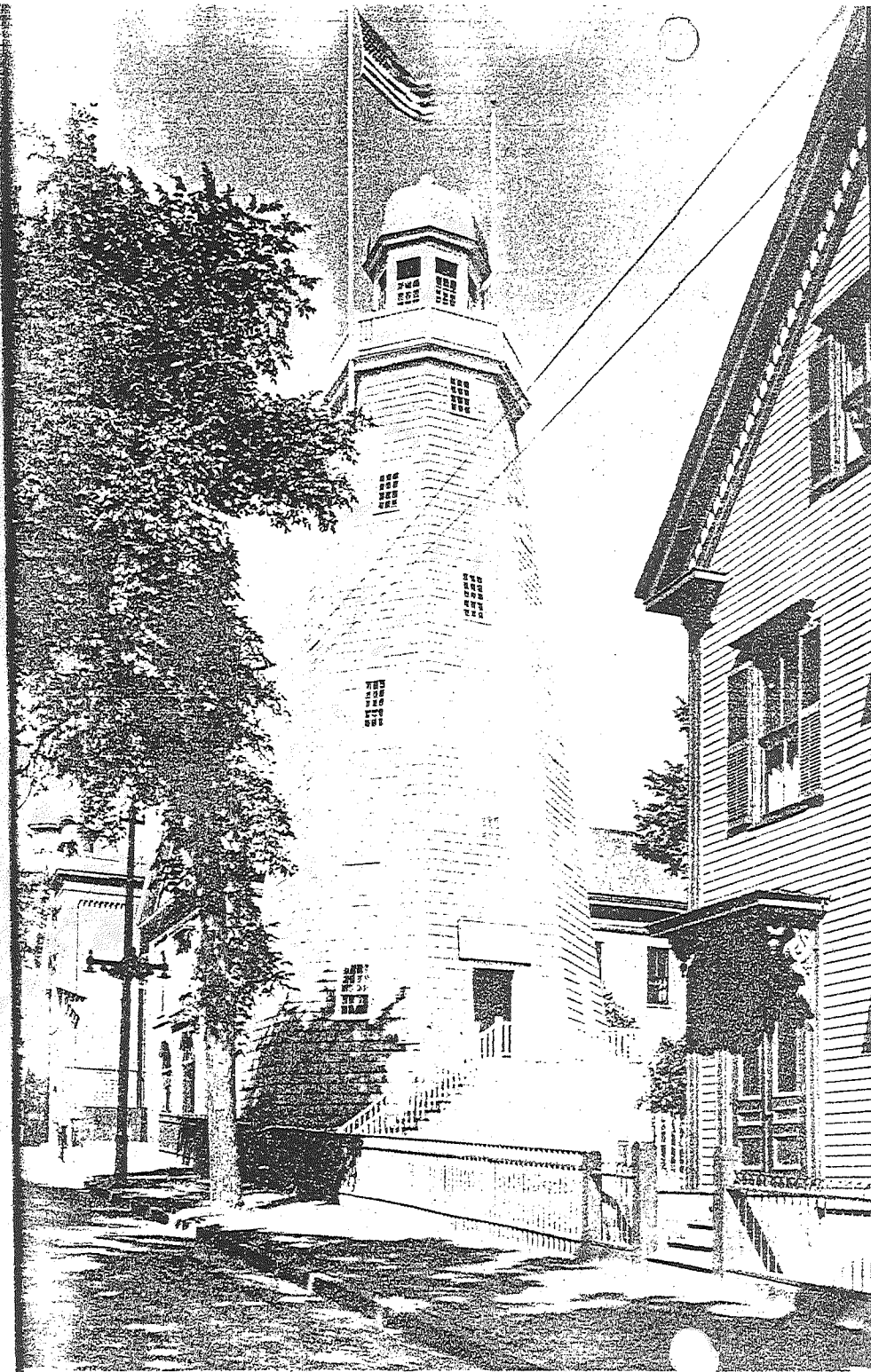

To: The Citizens of Portland

A quarter-century of council-manager government in Portland has proved that democracy and efficiency can be combined in local government. Although the report which follows is primarily a record of events in 1948, it also portrays some of the changes in municipal life since Portland adopted the council-manager plan in 1923. The comparison between the cost of gas and oil for fire equipment in 1948 with the cost of grain for fire horses in 1923 is only one of the many interesting parallels. During these 25 short years we have passed through periods of depression, war, and inflation which have thoroughly tested our capacity to govern ourselves well.

During the past several years your City Council has searched for an opportunity to broaden the tax base, eliminate inequities, and provide adequate revenue for the major improvements the community needs. In 1948 we were able to apply about \$380,000 from current revenues to necessary capital projects, and by the year's end we had reduced our debt to the point where a large school project could be financed by borrowing.

No prophet is wise enough to predict what the next quarter-century may bring on the national and international scene. Whether it be war or peace, prosperity or depression, our 25-year experience gives us reasonable confidence that our form of government will meet the challenge of the years by providing soundly financed services at reasonable cost and responsive to the needs and desires of the community.

We hope that this report will inform you as citizens about your government so that you can help us as your elected representatives accomplish the job that lies ahead.

The cooperation of the average citizen is essential to the fulfillment of the program, and we have had it.

I hope that this report will be widely read, and we will welcome any suggestions to improve the report and make it more useful another year.

## *Policy and Program*

The City Council is the core of local democracy. Elected by the people, this body of nine uses its best judgment to determine what the city government shall do and what general policies shall serve as a framework for the execution of the program. It controls the performance of the job by the appointment of a city manager, who is wholly and directly responsible to the Council and may be removed at will.

The City Council in 1924 was primarily concerned with the appointment of Portland's first city manager and organizing the new form of government. In 1948 the Council completed another busy year. Pension policy for firemen and policemen, which had been a vague matter of custom and tradition, was made specific in an ordinance which specifies the rights of the men to pensions based on age, disability, and length of service. This ordinance was adopted late in the year after a long series of hearings, discussions with the officers, and several working meetings of a Council committee.

Two other ordinances were adopted to modernize ancient practice. A confusing series of arrangements for the sharing of costs by City and property owner for new sidewalks was swept aside and replaced by the simple proposition that costs shall be split equally. Likewise, the City's arrangements for the acceptance and improvement of existing streets were placed on a solid footing by an ordinance that virtually commits the City to acceptance if a majority of the abutting owners as to number and value agree to pay one-third of the cost.

The Council acceded to a wide demand in the community for the legalization of beano games to be conducted by non-profit local organizations but surrounded its consent to a State license with restrictions that will prevent its becoming a racket such as led to the prohibition of beano in 1943.

Other matters of policy included a decision to facilitate the sale of the Federal housing project on Brighton Avenue to private owners, a revision upwards of building permit and cemetery fees, an acceptance of a very satisfactory \$25,000 settlement with the Maritime Commission for damage done to the City's ferry slip in 1943, and the adoption of an official map of the City prepared by the Planning Board.

Throughout the year the democratic process was enlivened by citizens who refused to accept a solution for additional fire protection at

Peaks Island. This solution, recommended by the Manager and adopted by the Council, more than doubled the extent and quality of fire and police protection on the Island but did not meet the initial request of the citizens as to the number of firemen to be assigned. The Charter processes of referendum and recall were utilized to their legal extent, and the protest continued for eight months, ending in August with a recall petition carrying many forged and invalid signatures.

Council decisions on the program of action began with the adoption of the budget in January and continued to August when the tax commitment was made. The net result was a program which financed within an 80-cent increase in the tax rate a five per cent adjustment in City salaries required by the continued rise in living costs; the initiation of a professional salary scale for teachers; the rebuilding of a worn-out sewer and street on St. John Street; the acquisition of the Jack Junior High School from the Federal government, which built it; a major extension of the West Side trunk line sewer to reach Forest Avenue beyond Morrill's Corner; \$50,000 of improvements to meet minimum standards of fire safety in the schools as prescribed by the fire chief; resurfacing of car rails on Middle Street and of the rough Pearl Street connection between Middle Street and the waterfront; permanent repair of the hazardous Fall Brook bridge on Baxter Boulevard; and construction of a new sewer in Bay Street to serve the new First National warehouse at Rocky Hill. These were the major improvements completed in 1948. But the Council also set aside \$65,000 towards the school building program, \$10,000 to implement its program for the acceptance of new streets, and provided in the regular budget for minor improvements which are described elsewhere.

To describe the major policies established by the Council and the major elements of the municipal program is not to portray all of a councilman's job. Throughout the year the Council served local democracy well by a process of hearing, appeal, and minor legislation having to do with zoning, the building code, licenses, and other matters.

Under the charter this body of nine represents the whole community. It was charged with the task of converting the public's interest in municipal service into a program of action which would ration our scarce tax resources among the most needed projects. It did this job to the best of its ability. But, did it represent you? Where were you on the first Monday in December when three of your nine councilmen were elected? Were you the one out of every six registered voters who

had enough interest in local government to spend a few moments at the polls? Or were you among the five out of six who were too busy, not feeling well, or unwilling to brace the weather? These are searching questions because local democracy cannot flourish on a 20% basis of participation in local elections.

## *Citizen Counsel and Advice*

If councilmen and city managers knew it all, their jobs would be simple. But a community of 80,000 people raises many complex problems for its city government to solve. Perplexed officials, looking for the best solutions, rightly turn to outstanding citizens to help them out. In its regular operations the city government is grateful to the citizens who furnish unpaid and unselfish service on the City Planning Board, the Board of Trustees of Evergreen Cemetery, the Board of Managers of the Dispensary, the Board of Trustees for the Public Library, and the Board of Managers for the Dental Clinic.

In January, 1948, the City Council, having determined that the equity and adequacy of the tax structure was the Number 1 problem in the community, sought the advice of fifteen leading citizens to find the answers.

This committee, after 12 months of hard work, justified its appointment by making a series of concrete recommendations to the Council. These recommendations, with the action taken subsequently by the Council were:

1. That an appraisal firm be employed to approximate values for 500 business inventories to remove gross inequities.  
*Firm employed to complete work in June, 1949.*
2. That an appraisal firm be employed to make physical appraisals of office furniture, store fixtures, industrial machinery, and equipment.  
*Firm employed to complete work in May, 1950.*
3. That an appraisal firm be employed to revalue all real estate for first time since 1925.  
*Decision reached to revalue real estate, but firm not yet employed.*
4. That the assessment on household furniture be dropped as too expensive and too cumbersome to assess equitably.  
*Assessment dropped, beginning in 1949.*
5. That the assessment on business cash and credits be dropped

because it is highly discriminatory and easy to avoid.

*Decision postponed until 1949 assessment is in, to be sure that there is an adequate replacement for the \$600,000 valuation involved.*

6. That the assessment on other intangible property be dropped because it is highly inequitable, only a small portion of the values can be discovered, and it is easy to avoid by change of residence.

*Decision postponed until an adequate replacement can be found for the \$2,200,000 valuation involved.*

7. That the Legislature be asked to give the Assessors adequate powers to inspect the books and records of the owners of personal property. Such powers are wholly lacking now.

*Legislation submitted to 94th Legislature.*

8. That the Legislature be asked to authorize Portland to levy a gross receipts tax as the best method of broadening the tax base and providing adequate revenue for the capital improvement program.

*Legislation submitted to 94th Legislature.*

These 15 citizens—Chester G. Abbott and Turner Jones, co-chairmen, William M. Altenburg, Henri A. Benoit, James W. Boyd, Robert E. Brackett, Raymond M. Conary, Harold R. Cummings, Coleman J. Green, Herbert S. Holmes, Robert E. Huelin, Carleton G. Lane, Alton T. Maxim, Edward B. Moulton, and Leonard A. Pierce—have rendered a great service to the community which will be incorporated in a fairer, more adequate tax base for the City for many years to come.

In 1948, also, the Council put to work a building committee for the new million dollar Junior High School at Park and Deering Avenues. This committee had its plans almost ready for bid by the end of the year.

By the end of 1948 the City was confronted with another perplexing problem of great magnitude—the shortage and quality of housing in the City—and was considering creation of another citizens' group to go to work on it.

## *Getting the Job Done*

It is easy for citizens to take for granted or fail to comprehend the

A major accomplishment during the past year was the securing from the United States government the sum of \$25,617.55 to compensate the City for damage done to Portland Pier by the Maritime Commission during the war years, when ferry wings newly built by the City were removed by the Commission and replaced with wings of inferior quality.

No major cases were taken to court in 1948. The Legal Department processed 132 claims for and against the City, 94 zoning and building code appeals, 174 workmen's compensation cases, and 15 delinquent tax claims.

### *Registration and Elections*

The privilege that citizens have to take part as individuals in the election of their representatives is a fundamental principal in democratic government. The maintenance of the voting list is a function of the local Board of Registration of Voters. Residents are eligible to register for voting by having lived in the city for three months and within the State six months, and may be registered by appearing before the board. Once registered to vote in the City, a person remains on the voting list as long as he remains a resident, although he may move from one voting precinct to another within the City. Names are removed from the lists because the person is not found as a resident at the annual canvas of the City made by the assessors, or because of other information indicating the person is no longer a resident.

About 4600 new names were added to the list in 1948, but the net gain over 1947 was only 2164 because the report of the assessors and other information required the removal of over 2400 names. There were 30,805 voters registered, and it is estimated that there are about 10,000 legal residents eligible to vote but who have never registered.

The voters in Portland had an opportunity in 1948 to exercise their franchise in every level of government. There were five elections. The election of Water District Trustee, which was uncontested, brought out but 411 voters. In the June primary election 42% of the voters cast ballots. About 54% of the voters took part in the State election in September, 72% in the Presidential election in November, and about 16% in the Municipal election in December.

### *Public Buildings*

Maintenance of city-owned buildings is a routine operation; but the average citizen knows little about the City's operation of the public baths in the Milk Street Armory. This unsung public facility was used 9,234 times in 1948 by women and 37,103 times by men—almost a 10 per cent increase over 1947.

The municipal auditorium is the largest meeting place in the City and was used on 107 occasions by a wide variety of local organizations—the Town Hall, the Symphony, the two local high schools for graduation exercises, and others.

### *Public Safety*

A quarter century has seen many changes in the facilities for protecting the community from the hazards of every-day life. Police, Fire, and Electrical Departments, the Building Inspector, and the Sealer of Weights and Measures were all on the job then, as now. But most of the fire equipment was horsedrawn; most of the policemen were on foot; crystal sets hadn't yet been converted to two-way radio; the building inspector could take two hours for lunch without interfering with the job; and feed for the fire horses cost more than gas and oil for a motorized department today.

### *Building Inspection*

Contrast between building regulations of 1923 and those of 1948 is as sharp as the contrast between building materials, building methods, and ideas on city planning and zoning of a quarter of a century ago and those of today.

Besides the streets, sewers, parks, schools and public buildings, the private buildings form a great part of the city, and it is very important that they be properly constructed and appropriately used.

Since 1925 the Building Code has undergone many changes through the efforts of the Building Code Commission and the experience gained by actual practice in its application. Appreciation from the entire city is due a dozen citizens outside of the government who have



served as members of the Commission and have given unreservedly and without compensation of their time and expert knowledge in construction and kindred fields to perform the arduous task of establishing and recommending to the City Council two complete building codes—one in 1926 and the other in 1941—and an extensive revision after thorough review, of the building code in 1946. The result is a modern code of building regulations reasonably flexible in its provisions to allow latitude in materials and methods of construction yet adequate in controls to insure safe and sound buildings.

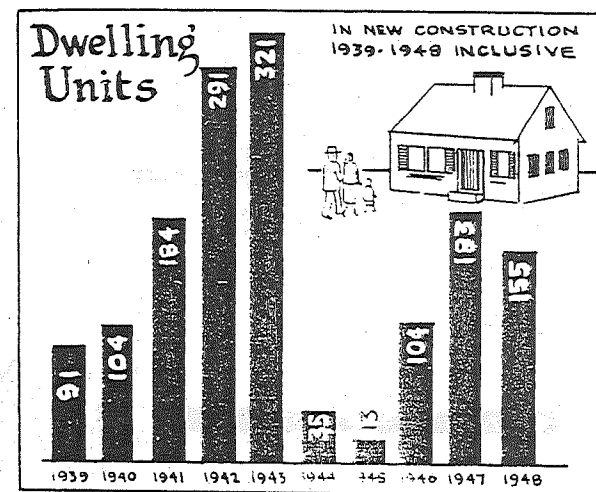
The Zoning Ordinance, first adopted in 1926, has likewise been developed over the years, and provides regulations respecting the uses of properties to conform to the general public interest. Residential areas are protected by the Zoning Ordinance against the encroachment of stores and industries, and provision is made, in appropriate areas according to plan, for all uses of properties necessary to the economic life of the community.

For years municipal licenses placed a stamp of approval on many places of public assemblage without too much regard for the suitability of the premises as to the safety of the patrons, the public. Also, many dwelling houses have been converted to accommodate more persons or more families on the upper floors. Disasters in connection with public places have brought to official attention the need for measures to insure the safety of the public, and effective ordinances have been enacted requiring that safe means of escape from buildings in cases of fire be provided and maintained.

#### *Building Inspection Service*



The year 1948 saw the Building Inspector's staff issue twice as many permits as in 1923 and making four times as many inspections for an all-time high. Regulation is red-tape and annoyance for the individual whose plans require approval, but it is protection and safety for property-owners and citizens throughout the City when the building code and zoning and safety ordinances are soundly conceived and competently administered.



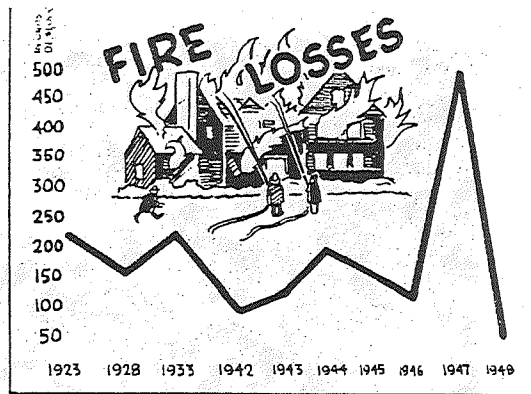
*Chart showing new dwelling units by years 1939-1948*

#### *Fire Protection*

In 1923 the personnel consisted of 109 permanent men and 39 call men. The City now has 156 permanent firemen, and the call force works only on the islands.

The total pumping capacity in service in 1923, including the fireboat, was 5,933 gallons per minute. This consisted of two motor pumpers and five horsedrawn steam fire engines. There were 22 horses in service. In 1929 the Department became entirely motorized, and we now have a pumping capacity of 14,750 gallons per minute from the 6,000-gallon fireboat and nine motor pumpers.

In 1923 there was only one aerial ladder, an 85-foot wooden one. Today we have five aerial ladders, four of which are all steel construction.

Among other improvements are the construction of a drill tower, establishment of uniform drills, creation of a fire prevention bureau and rescue company, and portable flood lighting outfits.

In return we have a more efficient Fire Department as measured by standards of the National Board of Fire Underwriters. In their report based on the 1923 survey we were penalized 1700 points deficiency. As a result of improvements made by the City and the Portland Water District nearly 700 of these deficiency points were removed in the 1938 survey.

*Old Engine Ore*



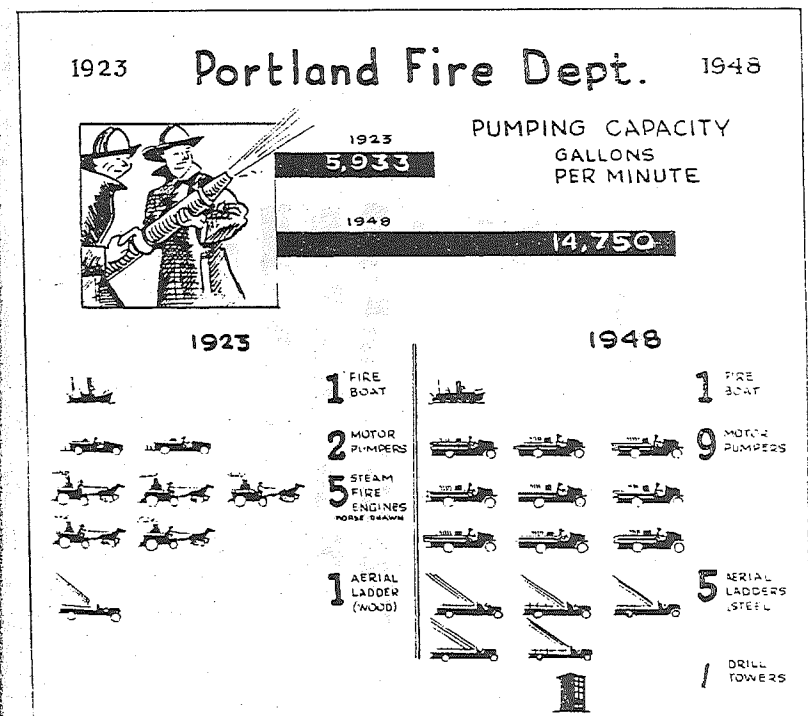
A more efficient department has resulted. In a year period from 1913 to 1923 the average yearly loss amounted to \$342,990.60. In the past ten years, from 1938 to 1948, the average yearly loss has been \$178,806.36.

The total estimated fire loss for 1948 was \$68,312.34, lowest loss in the history of the record system, which dates back to 1910.

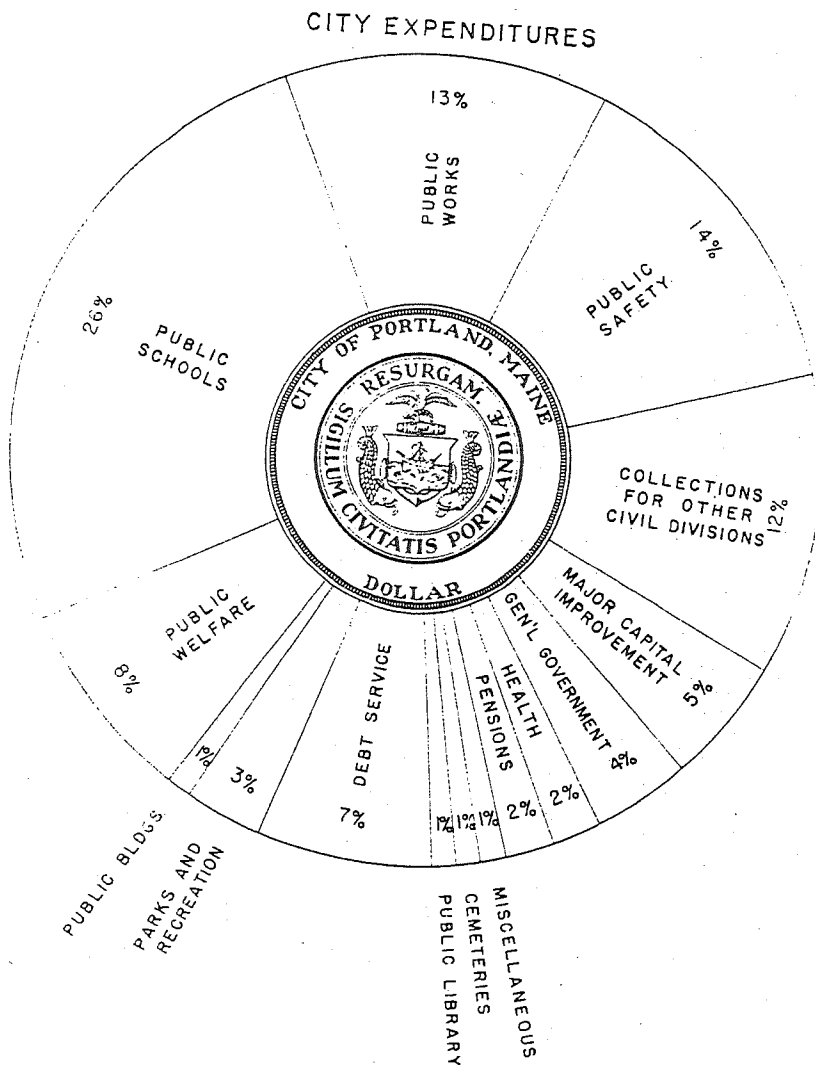
The Electrical Department, which is charged with the responsibility of maintaining the fire and police signal systems and of electrical inspections, has likewise been improved.

A new police signal system was purchased; one hundred and nineteen old-style interfering fire alarm boxes were replaced with new non-interfering ones, and additional boxes have been installed. In place of the 172 boxes that were operating on the system in 1923, we now have 262. Facilities have been provided for four additional box circuits, making a total of 16 now in service.

These improvements, including the radio installation, but not including cable replacements or extensions, and many other changes of a minor nature, total some \$50,000 over the years. In 1948, 2428 wiring permits were issued.
