* THE FIRE ALARM DIVISION REPORTED THE FOLLOWING STATISTICS FOR THE YEAR, ENDING 1994:

A TOTAL OF 12,520 ALARMS AND MEDICAL EMERGENCIES WERE RESPONDED TO, -- CITY WIDE.

OF THESE, WERE MANY DIFFERANT TYPES OF EMERGENCIES, - SUCH AS - STRUCTURE FIRES, HEART ATTACKS, VEHICLE FIRES, TRASH & DUMPSTER FIRES DIFFICULTY BREATHING, SMALL INSIDE FIRES, CAR ACCIDENTS, AND MANY OTHERS, - TO NUMEROUS TO MENTION.

OBVIOUSLY, - SOME CALLS-WERE MORE $\underline{\text{HEART WRENCHING}}$ AND $\underline{\text{SERIOUS}}$, THAN OTHERS.

THE FIRE ALARM DIVISION, NOT ONLY <u>TRANSMITTED THESE 12,520</u> CALLS FOR EMERGENCIES, BUT ALSO ANSWERED 14,912 CALLS FOR SERVICE OF SOME TYPE, WHICH WERE NON-EMERGENCY.

THE ELECTRICAL CREW OF THIS DIVISION, MAINTAINED AND MADE REPAIRS TO ALL FIRE ALARM CABLES, DEPARTMENT RADIOS, AND MANY OTHER TYPES OF ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT, WHICH IS ESSENTIAL, FOR THE 911 CALL TO GET ANSWERED, ALL THE WAY TO THE PROPER EQUIPMENT TO ARRIVE AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY. ----- (1 FIRE FATALITY WAS REPORTED FOR 1994)

* THE PORTLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT TRAINING DIVISION REPORTED AN EXTREMELY PRODUCTIVE YEAR-IN THE EDUCATION AND TRAINING OF PERSONNEL, IN EVERY DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT. -- A TOTAL OF 10,673 HOURS WERE RECORDED.

THE <u>ACTUAL TIME</u> IN TRAINING, <u>WAS MUCH MORE</u>, BECAUSE OF THE MANY TRAINING EVOLUTIONS WITHIN <u>THE INDIVIDUAL FIRE COMPANIES & DIVISIONS</u>.

SUBJECT MATTER INCLUDED ELECTRICAL SAFTEY, C.P.R., HAZARDOUS MATERIAL VARIOUS TOURS IN ALL TYPES OF BUILDINGS, TO FAMILIARIZE OURSELVES WITH HAZARDS AND STRUCTURAL COMPONENTS, AND MANY HOURS IN EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE.

THESE ARE ONLY SEVERAL EXAMPLES OF AREAS COVERED IN OUR <u>ON-GOING</u>

TRAINING, WHICH IMPROVES THE <u>LEVEL OF SERVICES TO THE COMMUNITY</u> - AND REDUCES <u>OUR RISK OF INJURIES</u>, IN THE PERFORMANCE OF OUR DUTY.

THE MEDCU DIVISION REPORTED OVER 1,700 TRAINING HOURS, WHICH INCLUDED EMS MANAGEMENT TRAINING AT THE NATIONAL FIRE ACADEMY.

MEDCU LT. CINDY WILSON HAS BEEN TEACHING A 911 PROGRAM, ENTITLED - "MAKE THE RIGHT CALL". IT IS BEING TAUGHT - IN ALL CITY AND ISLAND SCHOOLS, FROM KINDERGARTEN TO 4th. GRADE. THE KIDS LEARN HOW TO PLACE AN EMERGENCY CALL, AND WHAT INFORMATION NEEDS TO BE GIVEN, WHEN THEY DIAL - A 911 EMERGENCY.

MANY OFFICERS AND FIREFIGHTERS HAVE ALSO BECOME E.M.Ts. IN THE PAST YEAR, INCLUDING 24, THAT MADE UP THE FIRST PORTLAND FIRE DEPT. EMT CLASS. ALL OF THESE MEMBERS - PAID FOR THE STATE CERTIFIED COARSE ON THEIR OWN, WHICH SHOWS THEIR DEDICATION TO IMPROVING THEIR KNOWLEDGE, TO BETTER SERVE OUR FELLOW MAN.

- THE FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU REPORTED A TOTAL OF 3,153 INSPECTIONS
 PERFORMED BY THE INDIVIDUAL FIRE COMPANIES. ALSO, OVER 1,900 OTHER
 INSPECTIONS WERE DONE BY THE BUREAU INCLUDING, ALL TYPES OF PERMITS,

- * SOME NEW PROJECTS AND MILESTONES WERE ACCOMPLISHED THIS PAST YEAR.

- * A HARD COVERED, COMMEMORATIVE, HISTORICAL YEARBOOK, WAS PUBLISHED HONORING THIS DEPARTMENT, PAST AND PRESENT. -- THIS PROJECT, WAS A "FIRST OF A KIND" DONE BY ITS' MEMBERS, AND, WE'RE ALL VERY PLEASED, -AND PROUD, OF THIS FINE, QUALITY BOOK.
- * A NEW CASCADE AIR COMPRESSOR SYSTEM WAS INSTALLED AT CENTRAL STATION, FOR FILLING OUR AIR-PACK BOTTLES.-AND-NEW-LIGHTER-WEIGHT BOTTLES ARE NOW BEING PURCHASED.
